Health Care Advisory Committee Lecture Jan. 23 Dementia: Early Signs & Behavior Changes 6:00 pm -3240 O Street NW

Dementia affects 5-8% of people 65 years of age and prevalence increases with age. Yet, up to 30% of elderly affected by dementia remain undiagnosed and only half of those are adequately treated. Many people with dementia experience behavior changes that indicate negative impact on well-being of patients and in turn increase caregiver burden. In this presentation, we will learn about early signs of dementia and how to deal with some of the difficult behaviors that occur in dementia.

Dr. Aleksandra (Anya) Parpura is an expert in the field of aging and dementia with broad experience in teaching and training of families, professional and ancillary staff in nature of illness and behavioral management of Dementia. She has devoted 15 years to research of gerontological issues such as loneliness, self-identity, successful aging and care for Alzheimer's disease patients etc., and has authored a number of papers and educational materials on these topics.
