

## Trip to National Harbor-October 24 10:30 am – 2:00 pm



This month's trip is to National Harbor, we will ride the Capital Wheel-National Harbor's newest iconic attraction! With the installation of the Capital Wheel we have joined, London, Seattle, Niagara Falls, Brisbane, Perth, Cape Town, Johannesburg, Malacca Island, Pigeon Forge and Myrtle Beach, all of which have observation wheels that have become very popular with tourists and natives alike. From the top of the wheel you can see the Washington Monument, US Capitol, Alexandria, and Prince George's County. After riding the wheel we will have lunch at one of

the lovely restaurants in National Harbor overlooking the water. The group will vote on where to eat. Following lunch, you will have a few minutes to walk around and see what is there. We are leaving from St. John's Church at 10:30 am and we will be back at approximately 2:00 pm. The cost of the day, which includes round trip transportation from Georgetown and a ride on the Capital Wheel is only \$43.00 person.

The book is the story of greed and brutality as well as the story of the greatest humanitarian rescue mission of the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. This unique work of historical narrative is drawn from diaries and journals and recreates the twilight world of the doomed city. The book was very well received, and one reviewer stated that 'Milton's book celebrates the heroism of individuals who put lives before ideologies'.
