Tour of US Department of State Diplomatic Reception Rooms-January 30 @10:30

On Friday, January 30 we will have a tour of the beautiful reception rooms that were established as a space for official government entertainment. The rooms were renovated and underwent an architectural transformation from 1965-1989. The architectural improvements gave the Diplomatic Reception Rooms not only a national, but an international reputation.

The art which furnishes these rooms is reputed to be one of the top ten collections of American 18th and early 19th century art in the United States. It is said that there is no comparable project in the Western Hemisphere.

The tour of the State Diplomatic Reception Rooms is limited to 25 people, we will take reservations on a first come basis, please call the office as soon as you know you will be available to join us. You must arrive at the Receptions Rooms by 10 am to give yourself time to get through security as the tour will start promptly at 10:30 am.

Hollywood on the Potomac-Wednesday January 14 at 1:30 pm -GV Office

This program, featuring Mike Canning, a member of Capitol Hill Village who has long been fascinated by movies. After a 28 year career as a Foreign Service Officer, working as a press and cultural officer in eight countries on four continents, Mike Canning began his second career reviewing movies for the *Hill Rag.* He is also a freelance writer on film, public affairs and the US Congress in American feature films.

Mr. Canning will offer a comprehensive look at the intersection of our capital city and the movies—how Washington DC has been portrayed in American feature films. We will see clips from some of these films and Mr. Canning will discuss how Washington is treated as either subject, setting, or background. His book by the same name, Hollywood on the Potomac, examines almost 60 motion pictures as well as the 'Goofs' in how a film misrepresents the city's geography or practices. The book is the first publication to offer a comprehensive look at Washington DC in the movies. The book also features essays in three areas: on "Politics and Film," on DC filming locations, and a discussion of a potpourri of many lesser Washington Films in a section called "Selected Short Subjects"

After the presentation, Mr. Canning will answer questions, and sign copies of his book, for those of you who wish to purchase one.
