Book Discussion –<u>No god but God</u> March 14 -10:15 am @ 3315 Q Street NW

On March 14 we are discussing the book <u>No god but God</u> by Reza Aslam. Though it is the fastest-growing religion in the world, Islam remains shrouded in ignorance and fear for much of the West. In *No god but God*, Reza Aslan, an internationally acclaimed scholar of religions, explains this faith in all its beauty and complexity.

Beginning with a vivid account of the social and religious milieu in which the Prophet Muhammad forged his message, Aslan paints a portrait of the first Muslim community as a radical experiment in religious pluralism and social egalitarianism. He demonstrates how, after the Prophet's death, his successors attempted to interpret his message for future generations–an overwhelming task that fractured the Muslim community into competing sects. The book discussion will be held at the home of Margtot Backas-3315 Q Street NW.
