## America Visionary-John F. Kennedy's Life & Times-September 8 – 1 pm

September 8, 1 PM, Smithsonian American Art Museum, located at 8<sup>th</sup> and F Streets, NW. A docentled tour of the "American Visionary: John F Kennedy's Life and Times" exhibit at the Smithsonian American Art Museum. May 29, 2017 was the 100th anniversary of Kennedy's birth and the Smithsonian exhibit brings together images from the John F Kennedy Presidential Library, the John F Kennedy Library Foundation, Getty images, private collections and the Kennedy family archives that capture the dramatic scope of Kennedy's life. According to the Smithsonian, the exhibition is one of the most exhaustively researched collections of Kennedy photos ever assembled, and is based on the forthcoming book "JFK: A Vision for America".

Despite its fictional embellishments, her book provides a realistic account of the bishop's efforts to replace the lawless and profligate Spanish priests of the territory, his visits to a beloved Navajo chief, his friendship with the Old West explorer Kit Carson and his dream of building a cathedral in Santa Fe."
