# Thank You for Your CONTINUING Generosity!



All of the programs and services highlighted in this report would not have been possible without the generosity of our volunteers, members, and donors. Our supporters know that Georgetown Village enhances our quality of life but we depend upon your generosity for all that we do.

Membership dues represent about half of our annual budget; your donations make up the balance and enable us to provide the important GV services and programs that are increasingly needed, requested, and used by our members.

We welcome gifts at all levels, including those in honor or in memory of family or friends. There are easy ways to support GV, including gifts of cash or securities or making a gift from your IRA. Individuals over age 70 1/2 years may direct tax-free lifetime transfers of up to \$100,000 a year from their IRA directly to GV

and/or other charitable organizations. Such amounts qualify as required minimum distributions, are not includable in your gross income, and are not tax deductible.

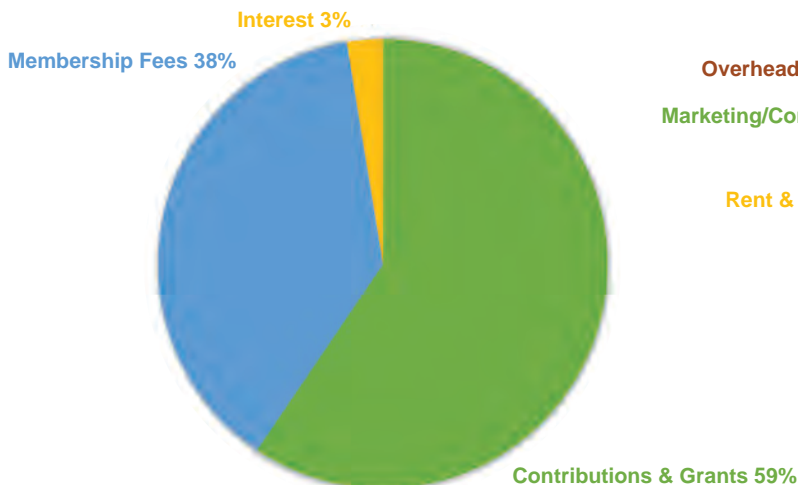
## The Georgetown Village Legacy Program

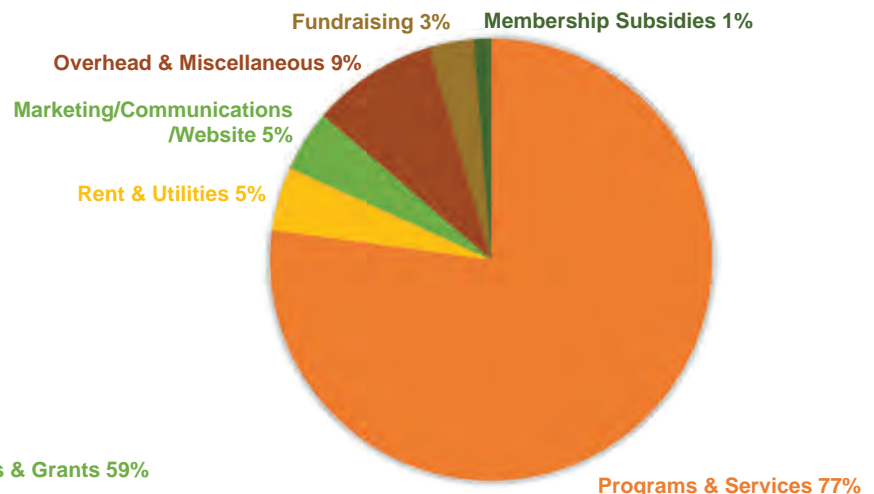
